UW-Eau Claire vs. Bethel University (TN) Carson Park-Eau Claire, WI

THE MATCHUP: The Blugolds and Wildcats are meeting for only second time in history Saturday. The game will be played under the lights at Carson Park with kickoff set for 7 p.m.

GAME COVERAGE: Blugold fans can listen live on Sports Radio 1400 (WBIZ-AM) in the Eau Claire area or online at sportsradio1400.com worldwide. Mike Sullivan and Mel Lewis will call the action. Bethel's WTNE-FM will also broadcast the game on the radio with Billy Hollowell and Monte Cunningham on the call. Live stats will also be provided on the Blugolds' website, uwecblugolds.com.

LAST TIME THEY MET: On September 6, 2008 the Blugolds traveled to McKenzie, Tennessee to face the Wildcats for the first time in program history. They came away with an 11-6 win from one touchdown and two safeties. Both of Eau Claire's safeties occurred in the first half on two quarterback sacks. Neither team could get anything going the rest of the first half, but Bethel did attempt a 38-yard field goal in the final seconds of the half. The Blugolds' Dan Mahaffey got a hand on the ball to deflect it. Eau Claire once again put points on the board in the third quarter with a nine-yard touchdown pass from Kyle Paulson to David Goodman, his first collegiate touchdown reception, to make the score 11-0. Bethel tried to get back into the game and scored a nine-yard rushing touchdown, but a failed two-point conversion left the score 11-6.

THE SERIES: The Blugolds currently hold a 1-0 all-time record against the Wildcats. When the Blugolds played the Wildcats last season, the institution was named Bethel College, but on August 1, 2009 the school officially changed its name to Bethel University.

HEAD COACHES

Blugolds: Todd Glaser is in his fourth season leading Eau Claire. He currently holds an 18-14 record with the Blugolds and a 31-31 career record. Prior to being named the Blugolds' 15th head coach, Glaser served three seasons as Marietta College's (Ohio) head coach. Glaser was named the WIAC Coach of the Year and WFCAC College Coach of the Year in 2007, while he also earned Ohio Athletic Conference Coach of the Year honors in 2004.

Wildcats: Dino Kaklis is in his eighth season as head coach for Bethel. At Bethel, Kaklis has posted a record of 42-33. In 2007, the Wildcats recorded their best record in the modern era going 11-2. He was named the 2007 NAIA Mid-South Conference West Division Coach of the Year for the third year in a row and was selected as the 2007 AFCA Regional Coach of the Year (NAIA Region I) for the second straight year.

ABOUT THE BLUGOLDS: UW-Eau Claire is one of 13 four-year institutions in the University of Wisconsin System, which is one of the largest in the nation. Nine of the 13 public institutions make up the Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletics Conference. At one time, the institution was affiliated with the NAIA. The university was the last in the conference to make the switch to NCAA Division III, going completely NCAA in 1994-95 after maintaining dual membership for eight years. Eau Claire is the largest city in west central Wisconsin and the eighth largest in the state, located 180 miles northwest of the state capital of Madison and 90 miles east of the Twin Cities.

The Blugold football program has been on a rollercoaster during its history which dates back to 1916 when the institution was founded. The Blugolds have won conference championships in 1922, 1948, 1956, 1963, 1964, 1981, 1983, 1998 and 2001. The three most successful teams in total wins were the 1998 team which finished 10-3, the 1981 squad which went 9-1 and the 2007 unit which finished 9-3. The 1998 and 2007 teams were the only two to qualify for post-season competition. The 1998 team advanced to the semifinals of the national tournament while the 2007 team reached the second round.

This season, the Blugolds return 32 lettermen, 14 on offense and 18 on defense, while they lose 24.

ABOUT THE WILDCATS: Bethel University, a member of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics and the Mid-South Conference West Division, is located in McKenzie, Tennessee (Northwest Tennessee). Bethel is a private, four-year university affiliated with the Cumberland Presbyterian Church. The Bethel football program first started in 1900 but twice in the history the program was discontinued, the first being from 1942-45 while the latest was from 1953-92. The Wildcats' overall record is 109-220-8. They have been to the NAIA playoffs twice in the history of the program, most recently in 2007. That year Bethel made it to the second round before losing to the University of St. Francis 30-27. Bethel won its conference title with a 7-0 record and finished the season with an overall record of 11-2. In 2008, however, Bethel took a step back and finished the season with a 4-6 overall record after starting the season ranked sixth in the NAIA. This season, the Wildcats return 62 lettermen while they only lose 12. In addition they return six starters on offense and nine on defense.

Bethel kicked off its 2009 campaign last week with a game against Saint Xavier in Chicago, Illinois. In the game, the Bethel University Wildcats were not able to take advantage of seven Saint Xavier turnovers and lost 26-13. Bethel picked off three passes in the first half and recovered four fumbles in the game. The Wildcats scored twice in the last 6:37 to avoid the shutout.

2009 NCAA RULES CHANGES: This year the NCAA Football Rules Committee made a very small number of changes in the rules, reflecting the general satisfaction of the college football community for the rules currently in place. The committee continues to focus on player safety and sportsmanship as areas that need vigilance. Added to the rule book is a Statement on Sportsmanship that draws coaches' attention to their responsibility for the behavior of the student-athletes.

The helmet chin strap is included in the face-mask foul. It is a personal foul if a player twists, turns or pulls the face mask, any helmet opening, or now the chin strap of an opponent.

The recent trend toward punters using a rugby-style kick has created a competitive disadvantage favoring the punting team. Because the player runs for several yards before kicking the ball, his teammates have more time to move downfield for coverage. Furthermore, there has been officiating inconsistency regarding whether such a rugby-style kicker has the same protection afforded a "normal" punter. Under the new rules, if a potential kicker carries the ball outside the tackle box (defined as extending five yards on each side of the snapper) before kicking the ball, there will be no foul for running-into or roughing if he is blocked or tackled by an opponent. The kicker remains protected, as always, from unnecessary roughness fouls.
