

## Swimmers & Divers Host Oshkosh Friday

EAU CLAIRE - The UW-Eau Claire men's and women's swimming and diving teams, each winners of three straight dual meets, will host conference opponent UW-Oshkosh this Friday at 4:30 p.m. at the McPhee Physical Education Center.

The Blugold men and women have not lost a dual meet since a December 11 loss to UW-La Crosse. Eau Claire has since defeated UW-River Falls, Hamline (MN) and UW-Whitewater.

Last Saturday, the Blugold men snapped the Warhawks string of nine consecutive dual meet victories, a Whitewater school record. Eau Claire won the meet by a score of 138-105. The Blugolds left Whitewater winners of nine events, including the 400-yard medley relay. **Mike Carroll** (Sr.-Green Lake), **Matt Schuebel** (Sr.-Racine/Horlick) and **Bryan Dykstra** (Fr.-Racine/Horlick) all earned two wins on the day. Carroll won the 400-yard individual medley with a time of 4:26.51 while also winning the 500-yard freestyle with a time of 5:05.84. Schuebel earned a win in the 50-yard freestyle with a time of 23.13 seconds and was also the winner of the 100-yard freestyle, posting a time of 50.77 seconds. Dykstra earned wins for the diving side of the men's team in both the one and three-meter events. He posted a score of 258.70 in the one-meter and a score of 268.80 in the three-meter.

**Scott Heatwole** (Jr.-Port Washington) brings in the title of conference men's diver of the week after a solid weekend. Heatwole had wins in both diving events against Hamline and took second in both events against Whitewater. He posted a national qualifying score of 283.60 on the one-meter board against Hamline, while also winning the three-meter event with a 253.70.

On the women's side, the Blugolds defeated Whitewater by a score of 150-85 to move to 3-3 on the season in dual meets. The Eau Claire women also grabbed nine first-place finishes, including wins in both of the relay events.

**Emily Diehl** (Fr.-Prairie du Sac/Sauk Prairie) was the only Blugold with two wins on the day, claiming first in the 200-yard freestyle with a time of 2:05.51 and the 200-yard breaststroke with a time of 2:36.48.

**Sarah Myers** (So.-Eau Claire/North) was also diver of the week in the conference after a great weekend. Myers finished with two wins and two second-place finishes on the week, claiming first on the one-meter board against Hamline and first on the three-meter board against Whitewater. She posted a score of 218.35 in the one-meter event and a winning score of 245.30 in the three-meter competition.

The Titan men come into the meet 3-5 on the season in dual meets and have lost their last two. They lost to Whitewater on November 11, a team the Blugolds defeated.

The Titan women are also 3-5 in dual meets this year and have lost three consecutive. The Titans last fell 181-60 to UW-La Crosse on January 15.

The meet between the Blugolds and Titans is scheduled to begin at 4:30 p.m. at the McPhee pool.
